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





# BEING FRANK ON FOOTBALL

I have no sympathy for Mercurary McLeish, who gave up his job with Scotland just to manage a middle of the road Premier club. He got what he deserved in my view and good riddance. In fact, the only manager I had any genuine sympathy for was Steve Coppell of Reading, who found out to his cost that the second season in the top flight is often much more challenging than the first and although I suspect he knew this, he could do nothing to prevent them finally going down. He is however, an honest and unassuming guy

with a wonderful dry wit and he will be sadly missed in the interview room on Saturday afternoons.

In Holland, PSV won the title for the fourth consecutive year and on merit, I would say. Next season will be different though and I am convinced that Ajax will be a team transformed. Under Van Basten, I fully expect them to lift the title and leave every other team in their wake. We shall see.

And finally a special word of mention to the ED., whose beloved Ebbsfleet got to Wembley for the first time in their history and actually lifted the trophy. It is Andy's local team and if you are a bit confused by all this, they used



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to be called Gravesend & Northfleet, but this new name seems to have improved their image no end ...or should that read Gravesend? Now who is confused?

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
