Still, the vegan thing seems to work.

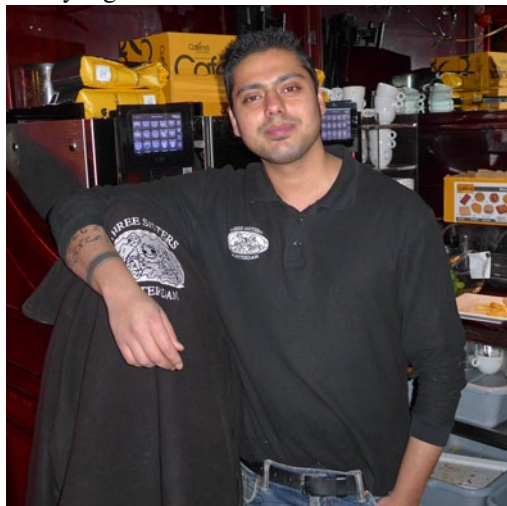
Try it guys, you'll be surprised at how quickly you'll learn to love being whipped and cursed at.

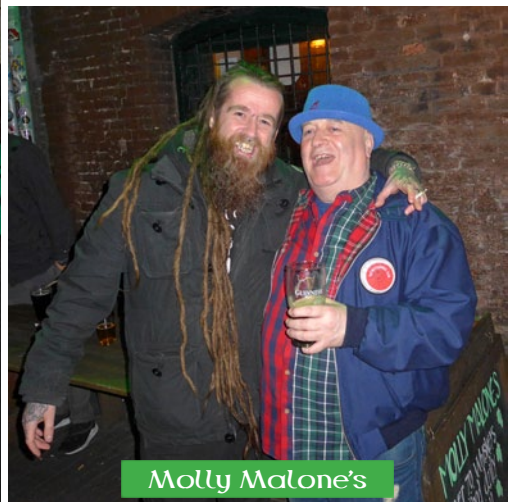

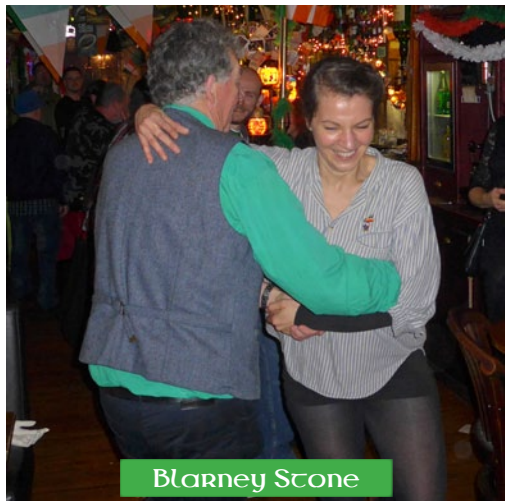

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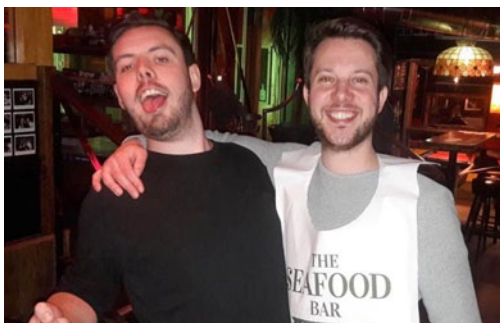


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IN THE POOLBAR

BEING FRANK ON FOOTBALL

Ajax performed exceedingly well in the Champions League by defeating Real Madrid 1-4 in Spain, only to lose in the Eredivisie to AZ Alkmaar the following week.

How strange it is this football game sometimes, and I can only assume their loss in the Netherlands was down to complacency setting in, because they did everything right in their last European adventure, when their display was quite simply top draw, and I suspect that most of the remaining sides in the Champions League would not have been looking forward to a confrontation with the Amsterdam club!

In the end, it was Italian giants Juventus who were matched with them, and perhaps without the services of their star player Ronaldo, who pulled out with a hamstring injury for Portugal recently in the European Championships. Cristiano Ronaldo believes that he will pull through but that was not the impression I got when he was removed in some pain in that international encounter that the Portuguese could only draw.

I would suggest that Barcelona and Manchester City are still the hot favourites in this competition to progress to the finals, but Ajax have exceeded all expectations by getting this far, and their young squad have

the belief to continue to surprise people in this competition.

In the Premier dog fight between Manchester City and Liverpool, it is still neck and neck, and I can see this going right to the wire. The Reds know that they cannot afford any more slip-ups but on paper at least, they do have a relatively easier run-in. Unfortunately for them however, football games are not won on paper.

At the bottom, I think we can safely say that Huddersfield Town are more or less down, and I think Fulham and probably Cardiff City will join them.

Coming up from the Championship, I would expect to see both Leeds United and Norwich City, and my favourites to progress in the play-off's would be Aston Villa!

PSV are now five points ahead of Ajax again in the Eredivisie, and it would be a major shock if the side from Eindhoven let a lead of this size slip between now and the end of the season, so they could be crowned as the Dutch Champions for the second season in a row.

Ipswich Town look almost certain to drop further down the football pyramid for the first time since 1957 and as things stand they are a staggering 13 points behind the rest of the pack and relegation seems inevitable. Manager Paul Lambert has committed himself to the



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club regardless of what happens this term. You could argue he is very lucky to be given an extended run, because his track record is worse than Paul Hurst, who was sacked after 14 games of their very poor league campaign.

How life has changed for the club from Suffolk, who in the late seventies and early eighties won the FA Cup and the UEFA Cup but nothing stays the same in football and they can only hope for a swift return from whence they came next term, all being well.

Yet, even that prospect seems rather remote. Coventry City had to drop further down the leagues before they bounced back last season and Sunderland are not finding life easy down there and they may not come straight back up! As for the Sky Blues, they were a top flight club for 32 years but since the turn of the century they have slowly but surely gone backwards, and that incidentally coincided with the building of a new stadium. Town went down from the top flight of English football when they began work on a new stand during the course of the season, which left Portman Road empty behind one of their goals for a large chunk of the season.

In football terms, to build for the future should never be a purely material objective and the hopes for clubs at this level of football, is to generate talent from their youth squads – if of course, they can deter the big fish from hovering the pond!
