RB Leipzig have that privilege by a point from Bayern and two from Borussia Monchengladbach. Borussia Dortmund lie in fourth, just four points off the leaders, so it is a thrilling affair over there it seems.

Sadly, after their second season back in the top division it rather looks as if Fortuna Dusseldorf will return from whence they came. I find this particularly disappointing as they are paired with Ipswich Town and once a season a group of them come over and take in a game at Portman Road.
